The cost of the weekend's events is \$65 per person or \$130 per couple.


This includes the Friday night party at the Memorial Union and the Saturday evening dinner at Monona Terrace.

December 2010 - West HOUSE Student Voice Retreat



The Key to change is creating the space for young people to imagine a better way of life and support them so they can act on that vision.—S. Ginwright.

This year's Student Voice Retreat, attended by over 100 students in 9th through 12th grade and 20 West staff, focused on helping students learn how to use their voice for positive leadership. The retreat was facilitated by Roberto Rodriguez, a Madison Memorial graduate who now runs The Good Life organization in Chicago. Roberto uses the story of hip hop and history of music to encourage students to use their voices for power in creative endeavors.

The students spent the morning exploring how other youth cultures have found their voice and used it for positive change. Groups of students and staff spent time processing who they choose to surround themselves with and how that impacts the choices they make. They also talked about the labels that others put on them, versus how they really feel about themselves and how they can use their words to create a positive environment in our school and community.

In the afternoon, the students had a chance to work with several local artists in creative workshops (songwriting, creating beats, movement, poetry/creative writing, or visual art).

Students then were able to showcase their creations with all the attendees. There was a stunning slam poetry "battle" about the difference between "schooling" and "education", an energetic display of dance moves learned to release stress, and an impressive song written by 15 students about the power of Youth Voice.

"We should do more activities like this, and let the whole school come!"

"We need to be able to have discussions like this more often!"

"This helps really understand each other and will make our school a better place."

"West is full of diversity other than race, and the ability to understand each other is time consuming, but is helpful to support those who feel helpless."

"I think doing this more often could really help students understand who they are and feel closer to their peers and teachers."

On a scale of 1 to 4, 86% of the students gave the retreat a 4 in terms of enjoying the retreat and being able to express their ideas honestly and comfortably.

We are in the process of creating a video of the day to be used in professional development with staff that we will be sure to share with all of the generous donors of the Class of 1961. In these financial times, we would not have the ability to provide opportunities like this for our students. We truly appreciate your generous donations as well as your consideration to give opportunities to the students that will be the future leaders of our community.
